# Levels of Public Investment in the East Midlands – A summary Analysis by East Midlands Councils and the East Midlands Chamber of Commerce.

East Midlands Councils and the East Midlands Chamber of Commerce have undertaken analysis of the levels of Government investment into the East Midlands, from the HM Treasury's Public Expenditure Statistical Analysis for 2021, published on 21 July 2022.

The summary analysis details trends in public investment into transport and other services over recent years and how the East Midlands as a region fares against other parts of England and the devolved nations.

#### **Transport investment in the East Midlands**

Transport investment is a key driver of productivity and economic growth. Transport spend per head has been significantly below the UK average level for all of the last 20 years. The additional financial support resulting from Covid has smoothed some of the disparities, but even so the transport spending in the East Midlands was just 64.7% of UK average for 2020/21, the joint lowest level of any UK region or nation. If the region was funded at a level equivalent to the UK average, a not unrealistic target, the East Midlands would have an **extra £1.26bn a year** to spend on transport.

#### Other public investment in the East Midlands

The trend for transport investment is reflected in other forms of public investment in the East Midlands. The most recent HM Treasury <u>report</u> confirms that the region also has:

- The 2<sup>nd</sup> lowest level of public expenditure on 'economic affairs', £ per head.
- The lowest level of public expenditure on services, £ per head.

The East Midlands has consistently received at or near the lowest levels of public funding in the country, across a range of different services and with a particular deficit in Transport-related spending. While the Government spending response to coronavirus has impacted this data, there is little in the most recent Treasury figures to suggest the trend is changing.

This analysis is important context for the work currently being led by partners in delivering growth and investment, and meeting the challenges of levelling up. With the focus upon, and opportunities presented by, the Government's Levelling Up programme, this analysis' sole focus is not to identify where investment in this region falls below levels that may be reasonably expected, but it is to identify where, with greater levels of investment, we could deliver so much more. After all, it is against this backdrop of lower public investment levels that the region's businesses continue to perform well and provide strong contributions to the country's overall GDP growth relative to investment. This emphasises the underlying strength of the region's economy and its untapped potential – and will be used to make the case for greater investment in the region to maximise national economic growth.

Continued support for Hong Kong British National (Overseas) status holders in the UK - The Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities (DLUHC) has announced that Hong Kong British National (Overseas) (BN(O)) status holders arriving in the UK will continue to receive support after the government confirmed the next phase of the Welcome Programme.

The package will help individuals and their families on the BN(O) visa to come and settle in the UK. Since its launch at the start of 2021, over 123,000 eligible Hong Kongers and their family members have chosen to take up this offer and applied for the BN(O) visa. Councils across England, which are already playing a key role to ensure BN(O) status holders are welcomed and supported, will continue to provide targeted English language and destitution support where the help is needed [further information available from <a href="help">here</a>].
