The East Midlands All Party Parliamentary Group (EM APPG) has issued a call for evidence into the wider social and economic benefits (and opportunities) of major infrastructure investment in the East Midlands.

The East Midlands region had been historically 'under invested' relative to the UK average across a range of functions, most notably transport, which has had a negative impact on regional economic growth, productivity, and social mobility.

The APPG is keen to understand the extent to which national infrastructure investment underpins local investment by businesses and councils that results in social and economic benefits for people and places. This analysis will be used by Parliamentarians to engage with Government and the National Infrastructure Commission to address the Region's infrastructure deficit.

Written submissions of no more than 1,500 words are invited by 5.00pm on Friday 9th June 2023.

Two evidence sessions will take place has part the APPG's Inquiry to provide an opportunity for Parliamentarians to hear from invited guests about the role of national infrastructure investment in securing wider social and economic outcomes for people and places in the East Midlands.

NATIONAL PAY OFFER

On Friday GMB announced that its members have rejected the LGS 'Green Book' pay offer by 64% to 36%. GMB added, "If negotiations aren't reopened and a revised offer made, we will move to industrial action ballots in some areas."

This follows last week's announcement that Unite members also voted to reject their pay offer.

Both unions will now conduct formal ballots for industrial action which are expected to run on a timetable similar to UNISON's strike ballot: from late May to early July. East Midlands Councils will keep members updated on any further developments.
