### **HOMES FOR UKRAINE: LATEST REGIONAL FIGURES**

As of Tuesday 11 April, the total number of arrivals in the East Midlands region is 6,730.

This data relates to Ukraine Family Scheme and Ukraine Sponsorship Scheme: visa data published by the Home Office.

Across the UK, the total number of Ukraine Scheme visa applications received is 284,200, the total number of Ukraine Scheme visas issued is 225,300, and the total number of approvals is 170,600.

#### **VOTER ID RESOURCES**

From May, residents will need to bring photo ID with them to in order vote in an election. A guide has been produced by the Electoral Commission for councils and residents which includes information on what ID will be accepted and the process of applying for a Voter Authority Certificate.

Please also note, the deadline to register to vote is next Monday 17 April.



## **REMINDER: UK EMERGENCY ALERT**

SUNDAY 23 APRIL—3PM

The Cabinet Office has launched a new system that will give the Government and emergency services the capability to send an alert directly to mobile phones when there is a risk to life. A UK-wide alerts test will take place on **Sunday 23 April at 3pm**, which will see people receive a test message on their mobile phones.

The Emergency Alerts system will allow government to get urgent messages quickly to nearly 90 per cent of mobile phones in a defined area. The alerts will only ever come from the Government or emergency services, and they will issue a warning, the details of the area impacted, and instructions about how best to respond.



## LAHF: GRANT DETERMINATIONS FOR THE EAST MIDLANDS

The Local Authority Housing Fund is a £500m capital grant fund in financial years 2022/2023 and 2023/2024 to support selected local authorities in England to obtain and refurbish property in order to provide sustainable housing for those unable to secure their own accommodation who are here under the following schemes:

- Afghan Citizen Resettlement Scheme (ACRS)
- Afghan Relocations and Assistance Policy (ARAP)
- Ukraine Family Scheme
- The Homes for Ukraine
- Ukraine Extension Scheme
