STAND WITH UKRAINE

Today marks one year since Russia invaded Ukraine. A move which shocked the world, and displaced millions of Ukrainians who fled their homes and their country.

At 11am the nation marked the occasion with a moments silence, reflecting on the events of the past year and standing in solidarity with the people of Ukraine.

Since the launch of the Homes for Ukraine scheme in March 2022, people from across the East Midlands have opened up their homes, offering hospitality and support to over 6,000 Ukrainian guests, helping ease the burden of displacement for so many families.

This level of migration is unprecedented, and we can't forget to acknowledge the hard work of local authorities both nationally and regionally to ensure a smooth transition for our guests.

Council employees' pay offer announced

Yesterday, the National Employers made full and final offers to the trade unions representing local government services ('Green Book') employees as well as the Staff Sides representing local authority Chief Executives, Chief Officers and Craftworkers.

Green Book/ Local Government Services:

- With effect from 1 April 2023, an increase of £1,925 (pro rata for part-time employees) to be paid as a consolidated, permanent addition on all NJC pay points 2 to 43 inclusive.
- With effect from 1 April 2023, an increase of 3.88 per cent on all pay points above the maximum of the pay spine but graded below deputy chief officer
- With effect from 1 April 2023, an increase of 3.88 per cent on all allowances

Craftworkers:

- With effect from 1 April 2023, an increase of £1,925 on basic salary
- With effect from 1 April 2023, an increase of 3.88 per cent on all allowances

Chief Officers:

• With effect from 1 April 2023, an increase of 3.50 per cent on basic salary

Chief Executives:

• With effect from 1 April 2023, an increase of 3.50 per cent on basic salary

Streamlined Asylum Process Guidance

The Home Office has released a document outlining a new processing model for asylum cases which will concentrate on legacy claimants.

The streamlined process will include an asylum questionnaire instead for of a personal interview for legacy claimants from Afghanistan, Eritrea, Libya, Syria, and Yemen who applied before July 2022.

These countries have been specified for inclusion in the streamlined asylum process on the basis of their high-grant rate of protection status, which is over 95 per cent.
