UK Support for Ukrainian Refugees

The UK support programme for Ukrainian refugees, in effect, comprises the Ukrainian Family Scheme (UFS) and a sponsored humanitarian visa route (Homes for Ukraine). To date, over 160,000 expressions of interest have been registered. On 18th March, Government published <u>guidance</u> for councils on the sponsorship route although there remain many issues to be worked through.

Role of councils - Councils have a number of important functions in supporting the Homes for Ukraine scheme, specifically in relation to:

Initial reception. Relevant councils have been asked to establish reception arrangements and provide welcome packs.

Data sharing. Unitary and county councils will receive the necessary data from DLUHC about sponsors/guests who have applied for visas (including the accommodation address). County councils can pass this data on to the relevant district councils.

Safeguarding checks. The sponsor guidance makes clear that prospective sponsors will be subject to accommodation and safeguarding checks. The checks outlined below must be conducted as soon as possible after the council has been alerted that a visa application has been made.

Interim payment for guest. The council where the sponsor accommodation is located should provide an interim payment (in line with other resettlement schemes) of £200 per guest for subsistence costs.

Provision of education. Councils are required to provide school places for children of school age. Councils will be paid additional funding to support with this.

Service referrals. Where necessary, councils should provide advice and referrals to specialist public health services as appropriate e.g., mental health services, adult social care, and children's services.

Work and Benefits. Councils should support guests to access local Jobcentre Plus appointments for benefit assessments and job-seeking.

Homelessness assistance. There may be some cases where the sponsor/guest relationship breaks down and the guest is homeless or at risk of homelessness. Councils' statutory homelessness duties will apply in this instance.

Community integration. Councils will play a key role in supporting the integration of Ukrainian families into their local communities.

Administering payments to sponsors. Sponsors will be eligible for an optional 'thank you payment' of £350 per month, as long as the sponsorship arrangement exists, for up to 12 months in total. Councils will administer these 'thank you' payments to sponsors. This payment will be tax free and should not affect the sponsor's entitlement to benefits or council tax status.

Funding for councils

- Councils will be funded at a rate of £10,500 per person to enable them to provide support to families. The £10,500 for Ukrainian nationals is for the first year. Funding for future years remains to be determined.
- This funding will be un-ringfenced, with a number of conditions attached, and will match the tariff offered under the first year of the Afghan Citizens Resettlement Scheme (ACRS) and Afghan Relocations and Assistance Policy (ARAP).
- The government is also providing additional funding to councils to provide education services for children from families arriving from Ukraine under this scheme.

Future guidance

- The initial guidance will be updated and expanded with further detail anticipated on accommodation and safeguarding checks, wraparound support including post-16 education, employment and training, administration of funds, fallback accommodation and data management.
- Eligibility for the scheme requires a named sponsor. The scheme will subsequently be expanded to enable organisations and community groups to sponsor multiple guests.
- We cannot be clear at this stage on actual numbers and whether there will be a gentle curve of applications being received and resettled, or whether the curve will be steeper. We will, of course, keep councils updated.

Integrated Rail Plan for the North and Midlands - The government's plan for delivering and sequencing major rail investment in the North and Midlands. The Integrated Rail Plan (IRP) sets out the government's proposals to transform the rail network in the North and Midlands.

It is a £96 billion plan that outlines how major rail projects, including HS2 Phase 2b, Northern Powerhouse Rail and Midlands Rail Hub, will be delivered sooner than previous plans so that communities, towns and cities across the North and Midlands are better connected with more frequent, reliable and greener services and faster journey times [details here].

Levelling Up Fund Round 2: Prospectus - The prospectus provides guidance on how local areas can submit bids for the Levelling Up Fund. The Levelling Up Fund is designed to invest in infrastructure that improves everyday life across the UK. The £4.8 billion fund will support town centre and high street regeneration, local transport projects, and cultural and heritage assets [details <u>here</u>].

Housing

Levelling Up Committee publishes exempt accommodation written evidence - On Monday 28 March, the Levelling Up, Housing and Communities Committee begins the formal public evidence hearing for its inquiry into exempt accommodation — a type of supported housing that is exempt from Housing Benefit rules limiting rents to particular levels [details here].

Climate Change & Sustainable Development

Tenfold expansion in chargepoints by 2030 - New strategy to improve the consumer experience at chargepoints significantly supports people without access to off-street parking and provides fast charging for longer journeys [here].

Green finance supports regional decarbonisation, but more required - A new report from the Midlands Engine Observatory looks at what green finance is already available, and what might be needed in the future.
