MAJOR NOTTINGHAM TO LINCOLN RAIL PLANS ANNOUNCED

Yesterday, in support of Transport for the East Midlands priority scheme, Midlands Connect submitted a Strategic Outline Business Case to The Department for Transport, calling for an £18m investment to improve journey times between Nottingham and Lincoln.

A report titled 'All change: The Castle Line', details proposals to make train travel more attractive, reduce car dependence and benefit the local economies.

Currently just 10 per cent of journeys between Nottingham and Lincoln are taken by rail, but if these plans get the go ahead, trains will increase from predominantly 50mph to 75mph throughout the route.

The plans have been developed with the support of TfEM, Nottinghamshire County Council, Nottingham City Council, Lincolnshire County Council and the Local Enterprise Partnerships. Network Rail and local train operator East Midlands Railway (EMR) are also key stakeholders in the process.

Midlands Connect recommends proposed milestones for work to start in April 2026, and complete in Summer 2028.

NET MIGRATION HITS RECORD LEVELS

Yesterday it was announced that UK net migration reached a record annual level of 606,000 in 2022.

About 114,000 arrivals to the UK were from Ukraine and about 52,000 were from Hong Kong.

In the East Midlands, the number of people in the region who have arrived from Ukraine and Afghanistan is 7,506, with a further 6,707 individuals arriving under the Supported Asylum Pathway. There are also an estimated 5,000 Hong Kong British Nationals settled in the region.

According to ONS, 2022 was a unique year for migration due to world events with those arriving on humanitarian routes from Ukraine and Hong Kong among the factors behind the increase. And despite the rise in immigration in 2022, their latest long-term international migration estimates suggest a slowing in growth over the most recent quarters.



HKBNO NURSES SECURE JOBS IN NHS THANKS TO EAST MIDLANDS SMP PILOT PROJECT SUCCESS

East Midlands Councils' Strategic Migration Partnership chose Klik2learn to provide a fully digital preparation course for the Cambridge Occupational English Test (OET) to twenty Hong Kong BN(O) Visa Holders as part of a pilot project to help them into NHS jobs in the Midlands.

So far four students have passed their OET exam, three of which have now secured roles working within the NHS.
