#### Flood schemes investment and Flood and Coastal Erosion Investment Plan

The Government has published the Flood and Coastal Erosion Investment Plan, this week, which sets out how new flood and coastal schemes will better protect 336,000 properties by 2027.

The funding will be accompanied by a consultation in the autumn, where the Government will look at how to better protect frequently flooded communities, following a call for evidence earlier this year. It will consider how to strengthen the assessment of local circumstances, such as where areas have flooded on multiple occasions, when allocating funding during the six-year plan.

The Government will bring in tighter guidance for planning authorities as part of a package of actions to better protect and prepare communities for flooding. Householders will benefit from changes to the Flood Re Scheme that will allow insurers to pay an additional amount for the installation of property flood resilience measures after a flood - like air brick covers, flood doors and flood resistant plasterboard. Measures to tackle the risks from surface water flooding are also included in the plans.

The announcement includes a raft of improvements to Flood Re, the UK-wide scheme which helps homes at risk of flood secure insurance cover. This will allow insurers to help flooded households to make their homes more resilient to future flooding using products such as air brick covers, flood doors and flood resistant plasterboard - and benefit from discounted insurance premiums if they have these installed.

The Government has committed to publish a Property Flood Resilience Roadmap by the end of next year which will further accelerate take-up of property flood resilience measures by identifying action needed from industry and government. The changes follow a government consultation and an Independent Review of Flood Insurance, led by Amanda Blanc, the response to which the Government has also published [details <a href="here">here</a>].

**Boosting value for money in the council finance system** - Plans to strengthen council finances, reduce risk to public funds and ensure councils are delivering value for money for taxpayers published.

- Plans to strengthen council finance and protect public funds published
- New consultation on proposals to strengthen local audit framework in response to Redmond Review
- Plans will support councils across England to level up and ensure that councils can build back better from the pandemic

Also confirmed is a <u>new consultation</u> on proposals for how the new regulator, the Audit Reporting and Governance Authority (ARGA), should act as the system leader for local audit within a new, simplified local audit framework.

Alongside this consultation, MHCLG has published two responses to previous local audit consultations – <u>allocating</u> £15 million to local bodies to help with the costs of audit, and <u>changes to regulations that will help to provide greater flexibility in payments for audits</u>, both of which show significant support for the government's proposals [details<u>here</u>].

**2021 annual survey of overview and scrutiny in local government -** This year's Centre for Governance and Scrutiny (CfGS) Annual Survey of Overview and Scrutiny in Local Government has been carried out in an environment dominated by the ongoing coronavirus pandemic. On account of this, although CfGS has continued to ask many of the same questions about the resourcing and structures of scrutiny, they have refocused to reflect on experiences on governance and scrutiny relating to the pandemic, as well as on pressures relating to local authority finances and commercial activity [details <a href="here">here</a>].

**Polling on resident satisfaction with councils: Round 29, June 2021**- The LGA measures resident satisfaction with councils every three to four months. This report presents the results of the twenty-ninth round of polling conducted in June 2021 [details <a href="here">here</a>].
