NATIONAL PAY OFFER

UNITE BALLOT RESULTS

This week, Unite announced that its members have voted to reject their pay offer.

Unite LGS 'Green Book' members have voted to reject their pay offer by 75 per cent to 25 per cent

Unite Craft 'Red Book' members voted to reject their pay offer by 76 per cent to 24 per cent.

Unite now plans to conduct formal ballots for industrial action with both groups, which are expected to run on a timetable similar to UNISON's strike ballot: from late May to early July.

East Midlands Councils will keep members updated on any further developments, including the results of the GMB ballot, which is expected soon.



2023 PAY AWARD FOR CHIEF OFFICERS

Agreement has today been reached on the 2023 pay award for local authority Chief Officers.

There will be ceremonial processions in London before and after the Coronation service at Westminster Abbey in London. There will also be a Coronation Concert on 7 May.
