Welcome to the latest LGA Apprenticeships Newsletter. This time around we're launching our annual survey, there's some updates on the dates and times for our pathway webinar sessions – **including the postponement of tomorrow's session** - some policy and news updates and a call out for help on the Apprentice of the Year event. LGA 2023-24 Annual Apprenticeships Survey

We are pleased to launch our annual apprenticeships survey for the sector. Now in its sixth year, the survey is an important tool for us to collect key information about the performance of the sector on apprenticeships, as well as to identify challenges, successes and capture the sector's views on potential future policy changes.

As we did last year, we will again be providing every council that participates with their own individual report covering key benchmarking data and a Maturity Model assessment to help you track your progress on apprenticeships and help with identifying future focuses and areas for improvement.

Last year 172 councils took part – a new record turnout – and we are hoping that councils will once again take part in big numbers, which helps us ensure that the survey data is robust and gives us a great baseline to work from in discussions with government about improvements we want to see to the system.

This year we are conducting the survey on MS Forms, so hopefully there won't be any issues with accessing it. This year respondents can edit their responses and also save them, so you should be able to complete some of the survey and come back to it later if you are waiting on information to provide answers.

There are two versions of the survey this year – one for upper and single tier councils (Counties, London Boroughs, Mets and Unitaries) and one for District Councils. <u>Please ensure you complete</u> the correct one! (and if you're not sure – please feel free to ask me!)

Both surveys contain the same key questions, but the one for Districts omits all the questions relating to maintained schools, as they are not responsible them. You can find the links below:

Last week the Chancellor of the Exchequer made two important announcements relating to apprenticeships:

- The government is committing a further £50 million for a 2-year pilot to explore ways to stimulate training in growth sectors and address barriers to entry in high-value apprenticeships
- The government announced that, as well as the National Living Wage (NLW) increasing by 9.8% to £11.44 an hour for eligible workers across the UK aged 21 and over from 1 April 2024, the Apprentice Rate would also rise by 21%, from £5.28 per hour to £6.40 per hour, also effective 1 April 2024

We look forward to speaking to government about how local authorities may be able to access the £50m pilot fund. The LGA also welcomes the increase in the National Living Wage (NLW) and the Apprentice Rate, but we are clear that local authorities need to be sufficiently funded to meet the additional costs without cutting jobs or services.

More broadly, we believe the government has missed an opportunity to explore the more fundamental changes to the apprenticeships system that are needed to make it really work for employers. We had another opportunity to highlight some of the changes we want to see, including greater flexibilities on what levy funds can be spent on, in a recent submission to the Department for Education as part of their stakeholder engagement around the apprenticeship funding rules for 2024-25. We will continue to find additional opportunities to highlight our calls for reform on apprenticeships with government ministers over the coming months.

Pooled PAYE Sessions – Slide Pack and Notes from Meetings with Councils in November

As promised, we can now share the slide pack and the notes we took from the two sessions we held for councils to discuss the Pooled PAYE changes announced by the government on 31 October. Both documents are attached to this email and have also been uploaded to the library section of the KHUB.

LGA Apprenticeships Mapping Tool

Just as a reminder, if you've not seen it, we updated our apprenticeships mapping tool in November, available on the KHUB. This is the first major update to the tool in around a year, bringing it fully up to date with the latest approved standards. There's a mapping tool newsletter available highlighting some of the changes and key things to look out for. Further updates to the tool will take place on or around the 1st of each month from December through to April.
